The Lucas Oil Golf Course is located 38 miles west of Louisville, KY. During the 1930's, English was a thriving town nestled in the rolling hills and ridges of southern Indiana. Restaurants, hotels, and 1000 residents called English home. Today, Lucas Oil Golf Course is home to an 18-hole championship golf course.

Over the years, the town of English was relocated to higher ground. The fertile valley, adjoining ridge tops and remaining streets and bridges created the perfect setting for a championship golf course. The unique challenge of transforming an abandoned town into a championship golf course attracted award winning golf course architect,

Dr. Michael Hurdzan.

The Lucas Oil Golf Course is routed to take advantage of dramatic drops in elevation and unique features in and around the former town of English.
















Course Guidelines

USGA Rules govern all play except where modified by local rules.

- Please repair all divots.
- White stakes define out of bounds.
- Yellow stakes define water hazards.
- Red stakes define lateral water hazards.
- Yardage on sprinkler heads and cart paths are to the center of the green.
- All players are requested to keep up with the group in front of them. Pace of play should be kept at or better than 4 hours and 20 minutes.
- Golf carts and motorized walking carts must remain on cart paths 50 yards from the green.
- Palls coming to rest out of bounds may be retrieved but NOT played. Such balls must be replayed from the original position with a penalty of one stroke.
